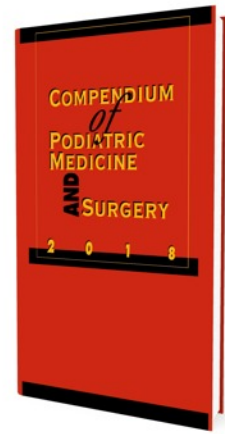


Contact Hours by State
